MANDATORY ATTENDANCE POLICY EXPLANATION

BLTA is a distinctive immersive and intensive program that includes a series of panels, immersive training sessions, and discussion groups aimed at honing skills necessary to be mindful, effective, and impactful nonprofit board members. ***Participants are required to attend - in their totality - all program sessions to ensure they receive the full benefit of the program.*** Mandatory attendance is essential to maximize learning outcomes, facilitate collaboration and networking among participants, and ensure a cohesive and comprehensive learning experience.

During the four-day program, attendees will take part in engaging sessions facilitated by specialists, partake in practical activities and simulations, and work together on team projects to put their newfound knowledge into practice. The mandatory attendance rule guarantees that participants actively participate and maximize the benefits of this valuable experience. ***As the sessions are interactive and linked, it's essential for participants to steer clear of external distractions.*** This means refraining from arriving late or leaving early, using phones, checking emails, or engaging in other activities during the scheduled program times.
